Amy Sherald is the artist behind the official portrait of former First Lady Michelle Obama. Chosen out of a group of 20, Sherald is the first black women to paint a presidential piece commissioned by the National Portrait Gallery. Originally from Columbus, GA, Sherald received her MFA in Painting from Maryland Institute College of Art (2004) and BA in Painting from Clark-Atlanta University (1997), and was a Spelman College International Artist-in-Residence in Portobelo, Panama (1997). In 2016, Sherald was the first woman to win the Outwin Boochever Portrait Competition grand prize. In May 2018, she will present a solo exhibition at Contemporary Art Museum in St. Louis, MO.

Sonia Lewis, aka, the "Student Loan Doctor" is the founder of the first black-owned and woman owned student loan repayment company in the United States. Her company, The Student Loan Doctor, LLC was designed to educate people about student loan debt, provide assistance in making tangible action plans towards debt repayment, and to provide coaching around other personal financial decision-making, such as budgeting, home loans and ownership, and loan forgiveness programs. Lewis is also an author of three books and host of her own podcasts.

Karen Okonkwo is a Nigerian-American self-described "serial entrepreneur," who co-founded TONL, a premiere diverse stock photo company. As a content creator, Okonkwo strugged to find images that showcased the diverse backgrounds her audience represented, thus she joined forces with a New York-based photographer to develop TONL. Launched in August 2017, TONL's mission is to "transform the idea of stock photography by displaying images of diverse people and their stories around the world."

Amy Sherald, Sonia Lewis and Karen Oknokwo all have a seat at the table with the many African American women who are have made their mark in history. Their extraordinary achievements and gifts to the world inspire us all.
