

June is a special month. It is the month that Black PR Wire salutes and celebrates Dads and Grads!





Jay-Z (Shawn Corey Carter) was born in Brooklyn, New York City. Jay-Z was a school friend of The Notorious B.I.G. He first started releasing records in the late 1980s. In 1990, he appeared on records by his close friend, Jas ("The Originators")

and Original Flavor ("Can I Get Open"), and later scored an underground hit single with 1995's "In My Lifetime." Drawing on Jaz's dealings with mercenary labels, Jay-Z set up his own Roc-A-Fella imprint in 1996 with entrepreneur Damon Dash and Kareem "Biggs" Burke. His debut set, "Reasonable Doubt", which reached US number 23 in July, attracted fans with a mixture of hard-hitting street lyrics and rhymes, epitomized by the collaboration with The Notorious B.I.G. on "Brooklyn's Finest." The follow-up, "In My Lifetime, Vol. 1", was released in the aftermath of The Notorious B.I.G.'s murder, and debuted at US number 3 in November 1997. Featuring guest appearances from Sean "Diddy" Combs (aka "Puff Daddy"), Lil' Kim, Too \$hort, Blackstreet and DJ Premier, this sombre and intensely personal album included the stand-out tracks, "You Must Love Me" and "Where I'm From."
